

What is a Clout Round?

The Clout Round is a long-distance shoot at a target laid flat on the ground. ✓

The central flag called the “clout” is mounted on a short flagpole, with smaller flags on either side marking out each scoring ring. ✓

The target is 15m in diameter with 5 scoring zones: 9, 7, 5, 3 & 1. ✓

Archers shoot 6 arrow ends, with 6 ends of scoring or a maximum of 324 points. ✓

How do I aim?

✓ The “sight pin” is stuck on with foam tape near the bottom of the riser. **Your normal sight must be removed.**

✓ Archers aim using the “sight pin” on their riser, aiming up into the air, lining up the ground marker “lollypop” and the “sight pin”.

✓ Arrow grouping is adjusted by moving the “lollypop”:

- Away from archer (*if shooting short*)
- Closer to archer (*if shooting long*)
- Left (*if shooting left*) & right (*if shooting right*)

✓ Archers who don't use a sight just shoot how they normally do!

Make a “lollypop”

Your ground site, or lollypop, cannot be: ✓
Larger than **75mm** in diameter.
No more than **150mm** above ground.

A pencil with a 75mm diameter cardboard cut-out works really well. ✓

Make a “sight pin”

Bring pins with different sized heads ✓

Foam tape
If you don't have any there will be some you can use on the day. ✓
